Agenda Title: Adopt Resolution No 2016-62 to Authorize a Notice of Completion for the Well

No. 11 Generator Project be filed with the Monterey County Recorder

Staff Recommendation: The Board of Directors adopt Resolution 2016-62 to authorize a Notice of Completion for the Well 11 Generator Project be filed with the Monterey County Recorder.

Background: Strategic Plan, Goal No. 2 – To meet 100% of current and future customers' needs and make timely improvements and increase infrastructure and level of services and human resources to meet needs of expanding service areas in an environmentally sensitive way.

Well No. 11 is located at the southwest corner of Reservation Road and Salinas Avenue and the portable generator at the well reached the end of its service life. On November 2, 2015, the Board of Directors authorized a budget adjustment establishing the Well No. 11 Generator Project (CIP MW-0206) for the replacement of the existing portable electric generator with a permanent electric generator. The Board also authorized the purchase of a new permanent electric generator from Quinn Power Systems for \$109,310 at the same November 2, 2015 meeting (Resolution No. 2015-52).

Staff obtained electrical engineering services from Aurum Engineering of Monterey to assist the District in the design. Staff then advertised and conducted a bid opening on March 1, 2016 for the portion of the project that installed the necessary electrical infrastructure and concrete pad to accept the District furnished generator.

Discussion/Analysis: On April 4, 2016, the Board of Directors awarded a construction contract to Monterey Peninsula Engineering (MPE) for the Well No. 11 Generator Project (Resolution No. 2016-20). The work included removal of the existing generator, providing a new reinforced concrete equipment pad, conduits, cabinets, and cables for a complete operating emergency generator. Subsequently, District Operations and Maintenance was able to have the old generator removed outside of the MPE contract and the District was able to save \$9,500.

The Board authorized not-to-exceed amount for this project was \$217,610. Work on the Well 11 Project began in May 2016 and was completed in August 2016 for a total amount of \$196,866.

The table below represents the authorized amount compared to the contracted amount.

The total cost of the construction amounted to \$198,866 which is within the Board authorized amount (Resolution No. 2016-20).

RESOLVED by the Board of Directors ("Directors") of the Marina Coast Water District ("District"), at a regular meeting duly called and held on November 7, 2016, at 211 Hillcrest Avenue, Marina, California as follows:

WHEREAS, the District Capital Improvement Program included the Well No. 11 Generator Project, to replace facilities which have reached the end of their service life; and,

WHEREAS, the Board authorized the purchase of a new permanent electric generator from Quinn Power Systems for \$109,310 at the November 2, 2015 meeting (Resolution No. 2015-52); and,

WHEREAS, the Board approved a contract with Monterey Peninsula Engineering to provide construction services for the Well No. 11 Generator Project in the amount of \$86,500 (Resolution No. 2016-20); and,

WHEREAS, Quinn Power Systems provided and installed the electrical generator pursuant to the contract documents and the generator is operation; and,

WHEREAS, Monterey Peninsula Engineering has completed the Well No. 11 Generator Project according to the contract documents; and,

WHEREAS, staff is recommending a Notice of Completion be filed with the Monterey County Recorder as the work was completed pursuant to the plans and specification and contract obligations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Marina Coast Water District does hereby authorize the General Manager to file a Notice of Completion for the Well No. 11 Generator Project with the Monterey County Recorder, and to take all actions and execute all documents as may be necessary or appropriate to give effort to this resolution.

Agenda Title: Consider Second Reading and Adoption of Ordinance No. 59 Amending Sections

3.12.040 (D,E,F), 3.28.020 (A,B,C), 3.28.030 (A,B,C,D), 3.28.050 (A,B,C), and

3.28.060 (B,C) of the District Code

Staff Recommendations: The Board is requested to conduct the second reading of Ordinance No. 59 to approve suggested updates to the Temporary Water Service and Cross Connection Control requirements and consider adoption of the Ordinance.

Background: 2016 Strategic Plan 6.2 – Routinely review policies and procedures.

The District has an active and effective cross connection control program. To continue to be as effective as possible, it is necessary to routinely review the District Code and update or clarify the requirements of that program. Staff recently reviewed the District Code, Title 3, Chapters 3.12 and 3.28 and is providing updated clarifying edits to the Code.

Pursuant to the California Code of Regulations, Title 17, Public Health, and entitled "Regulations Relating to Cross-Connections" the district adopted Ordinance 5. Ordinance 5 outlined the requirements concerning the protection of the potable water supply from contamination. Ordinance 59 further clarifies those requirements.

On October 17, 2016 during the first reading of Ordinance No. 59, the Board and Legal Counsel suggested several edits and those edits have been included and are shown in track-change in the attached version of this Ordinance.

Discussion/Analysis: In summary, the following sections of District Code, Title 3, Chapters 3.12 and 3.28 were edited:

- **3.12.040** (**D,E,F**) "Temporary service": This section was modified to clarify the use requirements related to hydrant meters and temporary water connections.
- **3.28.020** (**A,B,C**) "Cross-connection protection requirements": This section was updated to address properties with long water service lines after the meter are subject to review and requiring that all multifamily housing units with 3 separate units or more need backflow protection.
- **3.28.030** (**A,B,C,D**) "Backflow prevention devices": This section was updated to address backflow prevention device installation and testing requirements including that any change of tenancy, ownership, or renovation of the building will require review by district cross-connection control staff.
- **3.28.050** (**A,B,C**) "Administrative procedures": This section was updated to clarify that cross connection control surveys apply to new and existing connections as needed, timeline for customer notifications related to inspection/surveys, and testing of devices.

• 3.28.060 (B,C) – "Water service termination": This section was updated to further clarifiy processes and fees related to termination and restoration of water service.

Upon adoption of Ordinance No. 59, the entire Ordinance will be published in a local newspaper with the names of those directors voting for and against the ordinance or amendment.

Agenda Title: 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter 2016 MCWD Water Consumption and Sewer Flow Reports

Summary: The Board of Directors is requested to receive the 3<sup>rd</sup> Quarter 2016 MCWD Water Consumption and Sewer Flow Report. Quarterly water consumption reports of the Ord Community have been submitted to the Board since 2006 and is organized by land-use jurisdiction. Reports submitted in 2016 include the consumption information for Central Marina as well an analysis of variances between 2015 consumption and 2016 projected consumption.

This staff report also includes tracking information on sewer flows through the Monterey Regional Water Pollution Control Agency's (MRWPCA) Fort Ord and Marina pump stations. Central Marina sanitary sewer flows for the quarter ended September 30, 2016 was 99.937-million-gallons which yielded an average daily sewer flow of 1.0863-million-gallons-per-day (MGD). The Ord Community sanitary sewer flows for the quarter ended September 30, 2016 was 76.611-million-gallons which yielded an average daily sewer flow of 0.833-million-gallons-per-day (MGD).

The Ord Community's sanitary sewer flow to the Monterey Regional Water Pollution Control Agency (MRWPCA) interceptor system is measured by a District flume structure located adjacent to the retired Main Garrison wastewater treatment plant.

The District maintains sewage conveyance capacity within the Ord Community equivalent to 3.3-MGD. The 3.3-MGD capacity managed by the District is further divided into 1.1-MGD for use by the US Army and 2.2-MGD for use by others in the Ord Community.

Below are informational annotations for the data included in the report:

- The rainfall total for the 3rd quarter of 2016 (July, August, September) in Marina was 0.10 inches. This amount of rainfall is 0.19 inches lower than the historical quarterly average rainfall of 0.29 inches.
- The measured reference evapotranspiration rate (South Salinas) for the 3rd quarter was 15.54 inches, 1.10" inches lower than the historical quarterly average of 16.64 inches.
