Subject: Emergency Water Conservation Regulations Extended

Summary: On November 13, 2015, Governor Edmund G. Brown Jr. issued Executive Order B-36-15 calling for an extension of urban water use restrictions until October 31, 2016, should drought conditions persist. Given the severity of the water deficits over the past four years many of California's reservoirs and groundwater basins remain depleted and the need for continued water conservation persists. The November executive order directs the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) to consider modifying the restrictions on water use and incorporate insights gained from the existing restrictions.

The State Water Board's adoption of Resolution No. 2015-0032 and its May 2015 Emergency Regulation addressed specific provisions of Executive Order B-29-15, including mandating a 25 percent statewide reduction in potable urban water use between June 2015 and February 2016. To reach the statewide 25 percent reduction mandate and consistent with Executive Order B-29-15, the Emergency Regulation identified a conservation tier for each urban water supplier, between four percent and 36 percent, based on residential per capita water use for the months of July - September 2014. As directed under Resolution No. 2015-0032, State Water Board staff worked with stakeholders to develop and consider a range of factors that contribute to water use, including climate, growth and investment in drought-resilient supplies, to devise options for refining the new extended emergency regulation.

The new Emergency Regulation extends the requirements of the May 2015 Emergency Regulation through October 2016 and offers modest adjustments to help to respond to some of the reasonable concerns suppliers have raised to the State Water Board since it first considered the May 2015 Emergency Regulation.

More detailed information about key provisions of the extended regulation can be found in the Fact Sheet that follows.

Staff actions in response to the extended regulations include consideration about submitting a request to adjust the District's assigned Conservation Standard based on growth in the Ord Community, and sustained public notifications of the extended emergency regulations through the summer of 2016.

Subject: Receive Updated GPCD, Water Production, and Water Consumption Data

Summary: In response to the ongoing drought, the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) approved an emergency regulation that directs water purveyors to electronically report monthly water production and consumption figures. Also to be reported to the SWRCB is an estimate of the amount of water used each day by residential customers. This estimate, called "residential gallons per capita per day", or R-GPCD, more accurately portrays water use by individuals and allows communities to compare their efforts accurately with others around the state.

In support of the SWRCB actions, Marina Coast Water District staff has increased their efforts to compile and submit the required production, R-GPDC data, and other required monitoring reports each month. If available at the meeting time, staff will provide current tables and charts that show the various water production figures as of the February 2016 billing cycle. Staff will also include tables and charts showing the gallons-per-capita-day (GPCD) and R-GPCD data that has been most currently compiled. The documents are entitled:
