Subject: Receive and Take Possible Action Information Regarding MCWD's Implementation of Stage 3 of the Water Shortage Contingency Plan

Summary: The WCC will receive an update on water conservation implementation measures and actions taken by staff in response to the Board's resolution that some Stage 3 water use restrictions be implemented. Stage 3 refers to one of the plan stages contained by the MCWD Water Shortage Contingency Plan; that Plan contains 5 stages. The Board action was taken on November 3^{rd} in response to the State Water Resources Control Board's (SWRCB) approval of emergency regulations to ensure water agencies, their customers and all state residents conserve more water in urban areas. The goal of Stage 3 Restrictions is a 25% reduction in water use.

The primary actions taken by staff and related to MCWD Stage 3 Water Use Restrictions include:

- Production of placards and instructional flyers for restaurants, other commercial, and public buildings
- Development and scheduling of a December 2014 bill message
- Preparation and scheduling of a December 2014/January 2015 bill insert
- MCWD website edits and additions including:
 - Main Page Article
 - Links to additional information and resources
 - Updated posting of the MCWD Water Shortage Contingency Plan
- Notified Bayonet/Blackhorse Golf Course of the WSCP Stage 3 water use restrictions

Agenda Title: Review Proposed and Suggested Agenda Items for the January, 2015 Meeting and Future Dates

Detailed Description: The Commission is to review proposed agenda items for the January 2015 meeting and may suggest new agenda items for future Water Conservation Commission meetings.

Staff-suggested agenda items for the January 2015 Water Conservation Commission Meeting include the following:

- Introduce the new Commissioner; provide orientation materials
- Ongoing consideration of implementing Stage 3 within the Water Shortage Contingency Plan
- Discuss Water Conservation Education Programs with Mary Linzer
- Consider implementing WCC sub-committees

Potential agenda items for the January 2015 Commission meeting or future meetings include the following:

- Engage with local Land-Use Jurisdictions regarding gray water system permitting and requirements
- Consider and develop ideas for utilizing the CSUMB service learning/capstone programs in order to enhance water conservation outreach efforts
- Recommend to the Board that the WCC commence efforts to recommend changes to the Water Shortage Contingency Plan in order to dove-tail recommendations with the 2015 Urban Water
- Review BMPs; current water savings for achieving year-2020 per capita consumption goal
- Developing Improved Commodity Rates for Water Connections
- New Water Saving Devices and Technologies Consider rebates for rainwater catchment and use for single lot/parcel projects
- Develop a Conservation program for new developments that desire to employ rainwater catchment features
- Water Supply Augmentation Projects MCWD desal plant tour; recycled water use; gray water use
- Developing Water-budgets for Large Landscapes
- Address Temporary Landscapes and their source of water (hydrant metering, temp connections)
- Improve/expand the Landscape Incentive Program, including "Ocean-Friendly Gardens" programs and certifications
- Compliance Inspections of New Developments
- Review State programs/mandates with which MCWD maintains compliance
- Review State mandated science curriculum for elementary school levels $K 12^{th}$ grade
- Develop and implement surveys to discover what other Agencies do regarding Water Conservation Education for grade levels K-thru-12.
- Update Landscape Standards and Forms
- Training Opportunities in conservation-related topics
- Our Water Sources; Conveyance and distribution; Storage
