## Regional Urban Water Augmentation Project (RUWAP) Status Update

July 27 - 31 and Looking Ahead to August 3 – 7

### Activities During the Week of July 27 - 31: What's Being Accomplished?

#### PRE-CONSTRUCTION

- Potholing continued: crews were on Marina Heights Rd., 9<sup>th</sup> St., and Coe Ave.
- Project signs have been installed at Blanco/Reservation Rd., Coe Ave (near General Jim Moore) and Crescent Ave (near Quebrada del Mar) at the staging yard.

### Upcoming Activity: What's Going to Happen Next Week?

#### PRE-CONSTRUCTION

- Potholing – complete Carmel Ave and Coe Ave and begin on Abrams/Imjin Parkway

Advanced signage will be posted for the work zones. Traffic control for the work area will restrict the roadway to one lane and flaggers will be on-site directing traffic. Work hours are 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM)

### Future Construction Activity and Information: What's Planned to Happen and When?

- Recycled water pipeline installation on Beach Rd and Carmel Ave. is expected to begin the week of August 10 and continue into the second week of November.

Traffic control for the work area restricted the roadway to one lane. Flaggers will be on-site directing traffic.
