Regional Urban Water Augmentation Project (RUWAP) Status Update September 14-September 18 and Looking Ahead to September 21-25

Activities During the Week of September 14 - September 18: What's Being Accomplished?

CONSTRUCTION

- Continue RW pipeline installation on the Beach Rd. segment between PG&E access driveway (on Beach Rd.) to pressure reducing station in Reservoir #2 yard.
- Excavate and shore the insertion & receiving pits for the horizontal directional drilling operation scheduled for next week.
- Install changeable message boards for advance notice of work on Coe Ave.

Upcoming Activity: What's Going to Happen Next Week (September 21-25)?

CONSTRUCTION

- Resume pipe work on Beach Road. Horizontal directional drilling operation will begin on Monday (9/21) and is scheduled to complete on Friday.
- Advance notifications to be distributed for pipeline work on Coe Ave.

Advanced signage will be posted for the work areas. Traffic control in work areas will **restrict the roadways to one lane** and flaggers will be on-site directing traffic. Work hours are 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM

Future Construction Activity and Information: What's Planned to Happen and When?

- Installation of RW pipe is schedule to **begin on Coe Ave. on 9/28**. Work is expected to take approximately 7 weeks.
 - Traffic control in work areas will restrict the roadways to **one lane of travel**.
